A Call for Practical Mechanisms for Political Life Inside Universities



His Majesty King Abdullah II's meeting with the presidents of public universities reflects the royal will for the necessity of leveraging the political life, including the new amendments and what they require on the ground, by involving everyone in the Jordanian party life. His Majesty's invitation was sent to everyone, to participate in the political life -- we, the university presidents, evidently touched the vision of His Majesty the King regarding the expected political life, and the need to involve university students in this life, as a major component of our Jordanian society.

We, at Yarmouk University, completely agree that young people are the most effective group in Jordanian society, and that they are the group on which His Majesty and Jordanians rely for hope for a better future. In the meeting, His Majesty the King touched on the issue of freedom within universities with regard to partisan work, the need for it to be organized, and to have no overlap between the partisan work of youth, in contravention with academic norms, emphasizing that freedom of

expression and partisan work are safeguarded.

During the meeting, university presidents discussed proposed mechanisms, as His Majesty the King and the Crown Prince requested a timetable for implementing this topic, indicating that universities are required to be incubators for a political life that we look forward to in the future. What is required is a simulation of a political life within universities, for what is outside, by encouraging dialogue and accepting the opinion and the other opinion.

We at Yarmouk University picked up the royal signals early, and accordingly, Yarmouk University launched the Summer Youth Program 2022, which contains activities that fill the students' leisure with what is useful and that advances the student's skills and refines his personality. I myself stress the need to restructure the deanships of student affairs in all universities, as it's the body that works with students, in line with the change that we look for. Therefore, we must come up with new regulations for student unions and student clubs, in line with the political, social and economic changes that have affected Jordanian and university society, so that these student unions are representative of all students and not just a limited group of students.

His Majesty the King and the Crown Prince affirmed that they are the guarantor of this new political life in Jordanian society, in a way that meets the higher interest of the Jordanian state. The meeting with His Majesty the King and the Crown Prince was open, as the university presidents presented several challenges and obstacles facing their universities, noting that there will certainly be follow-up on these issues.

Youth Summer Activities

A Workshop Entitled "Health Practices and their Impact on our Daily Lives"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a workshop entitled "Health Practices and Their Impact on Our Daily Lives" in cooperation with the student initiative "Ta'mini Behmini", and presented by the pharmacist Reem Al-Othman from the local community.

The workshop focused on raising awareness of the importance of the safety of the body and mind as one of the life priorities that every person aspires to be able to continue his life naturally, away from diseases and pain and their repercussions, which basically requires following a healthy lifestyle based on a healthy diet, avoiding smoking in all its forms, and exercising regularly. The workshop also focused on the importance of every person's awareness of the need to eat all the food that provides the body with its nutritional needs of vitamins, minerals and others without increase or decrease and in a manner that maintains the health and safety of all the organs of his body, pointing to the danger of excessive intake of sugars and fats as well as table salt, largely due to its negative repercussions on the body.



A Workshop Entitled “Social Security Corporation and its Services”

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a counseling workshop entitled “Social Security and the Services It Provides” in cooperation with the student initiative “Ta’mini Behmini” and presented by Mr. Ali Al-Singlawi, Director of the Appeal Medical Committee Department at the Jordan Social Security Corporation.

The workshop included a detail of the corporation’s vision and objectives, its work programs, and the corporation’s constant endeavor to protect workers in the public and private sectors by preserving their savings and providing them with pension salaries that guarantee them material and social stability in the post-retirement stage, as well as assisting those who are out of work and non-workers through special programs for social security. It also Provides voluntary subscription services and purchases the necessary subscriptions to obtain a pension, in accordance with the instructions and laws in force in the institution.

The workshop also included details of using the official website of the corporation, which includes all information related to the corporation’s work mechanism, programs, laws and instructions currently in force, in addition to electronic services for subscribers, which enable them to obtain clear and detailed answers to all issues related to their subscriptions and pensions within a short period of time without the need to visit the corporation center. All that is required is to accurately register their information and access the electronic services.



A Workshop Entitled "Creativity, Entrepreneurship and Training Tactics"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a workshop entitled "Creativity, Entrepreneurship and Training Tactics", which was organized in cooperation with the student initiative "Ibn Baladi", and presented by Dr. Samer Ayasra from Amman Arab University.

The workshop detailed the concept of creativity and its importance and the need to think outside the box, and interactively sharing with the students some creative ideas to solve specific problems.

The speaker explained the concept of entrepreneurship, the basic conditions for entrepreneurial work, how to implement the entrepreneurial idea on the ground, the specifications of the entrepreneur, the problems he might face, and some suggested solutions. He also reviewed local and international examples of pioneering businesses that have become large projects that benefit society and the world, and their makers have achieved great financial gains.

The workshop was ended by encouraging the attendees, especially students, to be creative and think outside the box, and not be afraid to start applying ideas to create suitable job opportunities to ensure a better future.



A Workshop on "First Aid Basics"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a workshop entitled "First Aid Basics" in cooperation with the student initiative "Tamini Behmini", and it was presented by specialists from the Solidarity Health Center.

The specialists gave a detailed presentation on some emergency cases, such as complete loss of consciousness and fainting for adults, children and infants, and a practical application on how to conduct first aid to try to save the patient before the ambulance arrived, and the audience was trained on how to examine the case, predict the reasons for its occurrence, and try to save it.



A Workshop on Studying in the U.S. Universities

A workshop entitled "Studying in America: Application and Admission Requirements" was presented by Dr. Bakr Al-Ayoun from Auburn University in the United States

Dr. Al-Ayoun provided details of applying for graduate studies in America, the conditions for admission and how to prepare for that, as he participated with the students in an interactive dialogue in which he provided answers to their inquiries and questions regarding the topic of the lecture. He explained the importance of applying for the language exams for applying for postgraduate studies, and starting preparation for them in sufficient time so that the student can submit applications for admission in a timely manner. He also presented some problems that the student could face regarding this and the proposed solutions.

Dr. Al-Ayoun also presented the criteria for admission to some American universities in terms of considering student applications, what are the criteria that may increase the chance of student admission and how to work to achieve them, and the importance of each requirement and its role in the application evaluation process, calling for them to start preparing themselves to apply for graduate studies, because of that Benefit to refine the student's personality and provide him with better opportunities.



Hijjawi Faculty Students Participate in the Yarmouk Creative Exhibition

Five groups of Hijjawi students participated in distinguished projects in the Yarmouk Creative Exhibition. The participation included projects in electronics, communications, Biomedical, architectural, industrial, and mechanical engineering.



A Discussion Session on "Youth Empowerment: Volunteer Work and Community Service"

The Hijjawi faculty organized a discussion session on "Youth Empowerment: Volunteer Work and Community Service" with the participation of the General Director of the "We Are All Jordan" Youth Commission, Lawyer Abdul Rahim Al-Zawahra, the Director General of the National Platform for Volunteering and Youth Participation "Nahno", the National Platform for Youth Volunteering and Participation, Imran Al-Hamoud, and the Director General of "My Governorate" Voluntary Foundation, Eng. Abdullah Bani Hani.

The speakers agreed that the involvement of young people in volunteer work and community service through the various institutions concerned with this field is an important and essential step in developing young people's skills, refining their personalities, and increasing their self-confidence as effective people who enjoy the positivity needed by others, which means empowering them by providing them with work skills in different circumstances and locations. different as well as giving them the willpower to compete for well-deserved job opportunities.

The speakers emphasized that their great belief in the royal confidence in the youth and the royal support for them was the main motive for their involvement in volunteer work and community service.



An Interactive Workshop Specialized in "Reducing the Costs of Concrete Structures"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a specialized dialogue workshop entitled: Reducing the costs of reinforced concrete structures "Facts and Challenges", which was presented by Dr. Ahmed Salama from the Civil Engineering Department in the Faculty,

Dr. Salama gave a detailed explanation of how to reduce the construction costs of reinforced concrete structures, by reducing the self-loads of the origin, whether dead loads or live loads on it, as well as redistributing the design moments of some structural elements in the building with changing or modifying some of the structural details of these elements .

The workshop included dialogue discussions in which the students talked about the extent to which such methods affect the actual cost of the concrete structure, as well as the cost of arming it.



A Workshop on Advanced Machining Processes

A workshop in advanced machining processes was held by the Hijjawi Faculty For Engineering Technology at the MiniFab lab in the industrial engineering department on July 21st, 2022.

At the beginning of the workshop Prof. Ootom, the dean of the Hijjawi Faculty for Engineering Technology, welcomed the students and indicated the importance of the workshop to introduce the students to the advanced machining processes and become familiar with the engineering applications of such machining processes in the manufacturing field. Prof. Ootom also encouraged the students to learn about the machines and their applications to use the available resources for students' projects and for doing research.

In the workshop, students were oriented to different sets of machines under the supervision of Dr. Bani Hani, The Industrial Engineering Department Head, and the lab technicians at which students were introduced to the new 3D printers regarding their types, raw material used, applications, and limitations among others. Moreover, a small task was also implemented to observe the 3D printers building small scale models.

Students were also introduced to the laser cutting machine, plasma cutting machine, and CNC lathe machine which were purchased as part of the BITTCOIN Erasmus funded project in efforts made to establish a MiniFab lab at the Hijjawi Faculty For Engineering Technology. Students were given information about the different types of the aforementioned machines, working method, raw materials used, cut sizes, cutting precision, cutting speed, applications, precautions for use, safety measures needed, when to use each type of machine and others. Students were also given a chance to observe the different machines while working in small scale tasks.

At the end of the workshop, Prof. Ootom provided insights about the importance of having a MiniFab lab at the Hijjawi Faculty for Engineering Technology. He also highlighted the impact of such labs in equipping the students with the necessary resources to have successful projects and implement any of their entrepreneurial ideas which in turn can help the students to move from product ideations in business models into having product prototypes and commercialization.



A Discussion Session on "Strengthening the Role of Youth in Political Life"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized a discussion panel entitled "Strengthening the Role of Youth in Political Life", With the participation of a member of the Jordanian Senate, Madallah Tarawneh, a member of the Royal Committee for the Modernization of the Political System, Dr. Laith Nasraween, and the Director General of the Foundation for my Governorates, Eng. Abdullah Bani Hani.

The speakers emphasized that Jordan, in its new centenary, is entering a different phase at the level of political, parliamentary and party work. They mentioned that the youth are the ones who will motivate the parliamentary work in the next stage, especially since political work is based on the electoral law that regulates this work in general. They also encouraged the students to belong to political parties and noted that there is no longer any fear of belonging to any political party. They pointed out that the Parties Law gave the right to every person who was attacked because of his party affiliation to apply to the judiciary to obtain material and moral compensation.

The speakers stressed the need for young people to play their role in participating in policy-making and the decision-making process, especially since the law guarantees Jordanian youth to be part of the next political stage and system. To chart the political future of this country.

They pointed out that His Majesty, through the fourth discussion paper, said, "Towards democratic empowerment and active citizenship," which requires us, the Jordanian youth, to work together, find solutions, and be part of the next political stage.

At the end of the discussion panel, the speakers answered questions and inquiries from the audience.





The Hijjawi Faculty "Scientific and Career Day and Alumni Meeting"

The Hijjawi Faculty organized the activities of the "Scientific and Career Day and Alumni Meeting" under the patronage of the former Minister of Digital Economy and Entrepreneurship, Eng. Muthanna Gharaibeh.

Eng. Gharaibeh, representing the distinguished alumni of the Hijjawi Faculty, spoke in a dialogue session about the importance of students refining their communication and engineering skills, and supporting the academic knowledge they received during their studies at the university with training courses that enhance their knowledge of the accelerated engineering and industrial development taking place in various industrial, engineering and technological sectors, with the aim of Raising the level of their competitiveness in the local and international labor market.

The event included organizing a number of scientific exhibitions for the students' projects and outstanding research at the undergraduate and graduate levels, in addition to art exhibitions in various fields to enable students to display their artistic and creative works, and a career fair with the participation of a wide range of companies and institutions from the private sector in engineering and technology work.

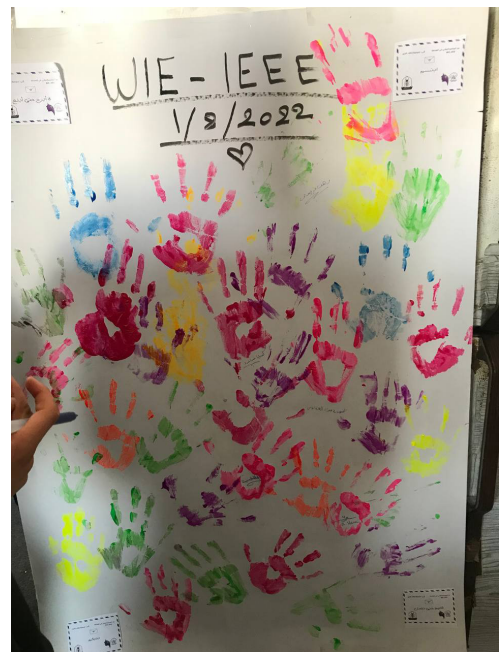


A Visit to the Charitable Orphanage "Zakat Khair"

Two Students Participated in the IEEE R8 Student & Young Professional Congress 2022 in Tunis

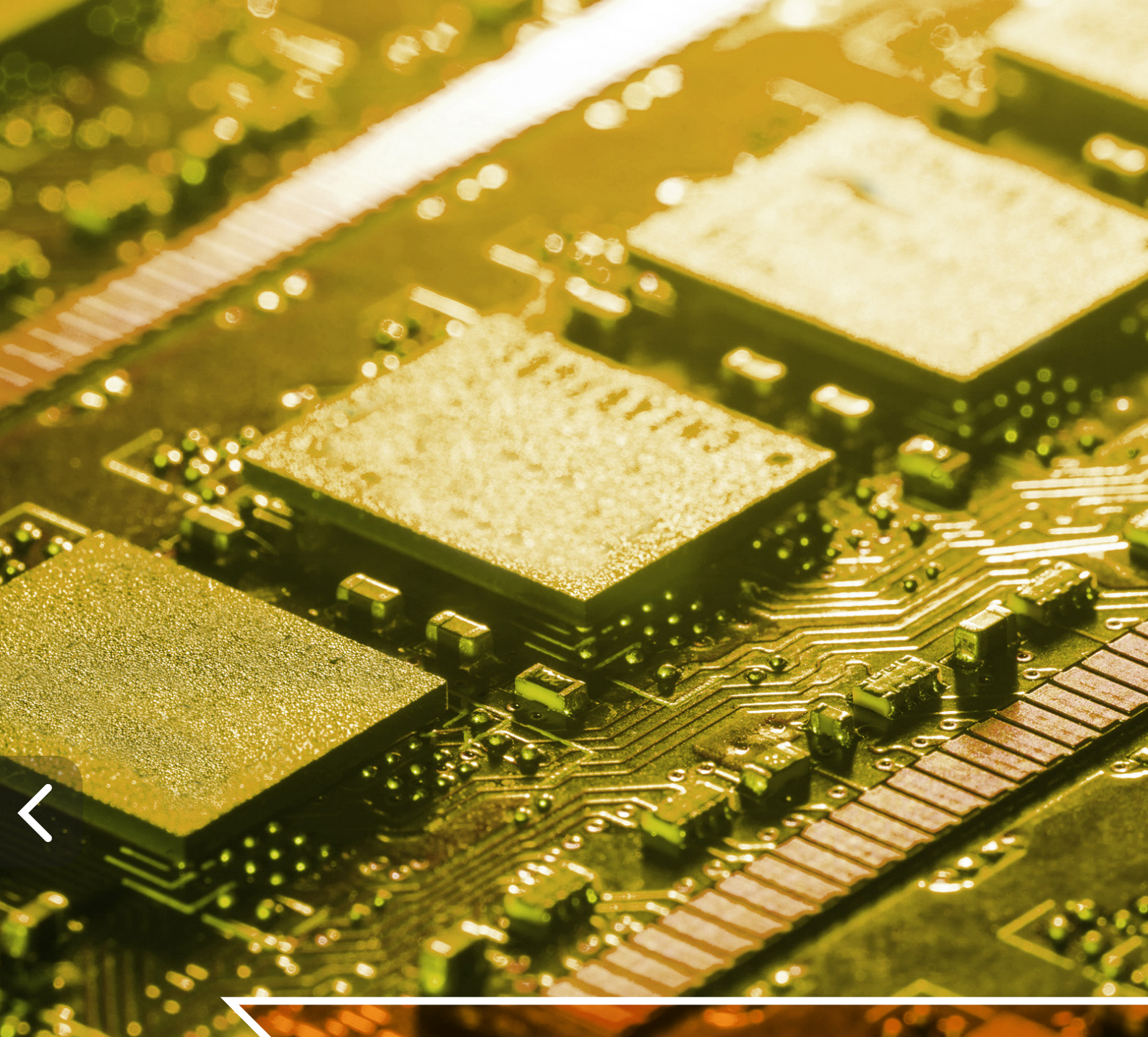
